Another way St. Paul does advocacy and justice ministry is through SURE (Sarasota United for Responsibility and Equity). SURE has a new Lead Organizer. I met with her for breakfast earlier this week. Her name is Michelle Jewel. She has a heart for this ministry. You can meet her and help create the vision for SURE at the Nehemiah Action on Monday, March 31 at 6:30p at Faith Lutheran Church. It would be great if we can have as many or more people as last year at the event. We had over 30 there last year from St. Paul. Let's do it again.
