#### Greetings St. Paul Lutheran!

Happy December! As the song goes, "It's the most wonderful time of the year". Not only do individuals get ready for Christmas, so does the church. Yes, you'll see Christmas decorations going up little by little. We try to make a progression of decorations at the church. The trees will go up one week, but we won't use the lights until the next week and then add the chrismons (the hand-made symbols of our Triune God that are the decorations for the trees in the sanctuary) the next week; so everything is in full-bloom for Christmas Eve. At the time I was writing this newsletter article (mid-November), we haven't heard from the nursery, where we get the poinsettias, and if they have any to sell this year due to the hurricanes. But if our typical poinsettias aren't available, I'm sure we will come up with a plan to beautify the sanctuary in honor of Jesus' birth.

The church doesn't just decorate to get ready for Jesus' birth, we also have other ministries that happen during this time of year.

Wednesday evening soup supper and worship with Holden Evening Prayer are December 4 and 11. Soup is at 6pm and worship is at 7p. Holden Evening Prayer is one of my favorite worship settings. It focuses on Mary, Mother of her Lord. Some of you may remember, that I was born on Mary, Mother of our Lord Day, (August 15), so her story has always been meaningful to me. I was ordained on my baptismal birthday. I set the ordination date on purpose. October 10, 2007 was a weekday so I needed to have my ordination service in the evening. I chose to use the service of Holden Evening Prayer to be the setting. So Holden Evening Prayer has many special connections for me.

The *Visit with Santa* is Saturday, December 7 from 1-3p in the Fellowship Hall. It's a great way for kids and their families to see Santa, get free pictures with him, and also learn about the reason for the season and get invited to St. Paul's Christmas Eve worship service.

On Wednesday, December 18, we will have the soup supper at 6pm but instead of Holden Evening Prayer at 7p we will have the Blue Christmas service. It is a reflective worship service that recognizes not everyone is joyous during the Christmas season. There are many emotions beyond "It's a wonderful time of the year" and this worship service names those and allows us to grieve, doubt, and question, in a safe place.

On Tuesday, December 24, at 7p we will have our Christmas Eve worship service. It is a family-friendly worship service that includes our vocal and bell choir, candle lighting to Silent Night, and Holy Communion.

And all the while we are getting ready for Jesus' birth and celebrating it, we will be planning for January and February events too. Please see page six for information on our 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Homecoming worship services in January and February. And the senior adult Vacation Bible School information is on page six as well. You'll hear more about those events in the January newsletter too.






#### Senior Adult Vacation Bible School!


