Greetings St. Paul Lutheran Church!

I shared recently in worship that St. Paul is in conversation with the Sarasota Moravian Church for shared space usage. You may have seen their pastor and other members of the church at our worship services and at coffee hour lately. They currently are worshiping in a different church but are looking for a space that can give them more consistent time for worship. While all the details are still being worked out I wanted to share some information that we know.

If you haven't heard of the Moravian Church, that's okay. They are a smaller denomination especially in the United States. The name Moravian identifies the fact that this historic church had its origin in ancient Bohemia and Moravia in what is the present day Czech Republic. In the mid-ninth century these countries converted to Christianity. In the centuries that followed, Bohemia and Moravia gradually fell under the ecclesiastical juristiction of Rome, but some of the Czech people protested.

The foremost of the Czech reformers, John Hus (1369-1415) was a professor of philosophy and rector of the University of Prague. The Bethlehem Chapel in Prague, where Hus preached, became a rallying place for the movement against many practices of the Roman Catholic clergy



and hierachy. Hus was accused of heresy, underwent a long trial at the Council of Constance, and was burned at the stake on July 6, 1415. Howevery, the reformation spirit did not die with Hus. The Moravian Church, or Unitas Fratrum (Unity of Brethren), as it has been officially known since 1457, arose as followers of Hus gathered in the village of Kunvald, about 100 miles east of Prague, in eastern Bohemia, and organized the church. This was 60 years before Martin Luther began his reformation and 100 years before the establishment of the Anglican Church. If you do look at their website and do not find the Sarasota Church listed under Florida congregations it is because their website has not been updated to reflect the Sarsota Church. This will be remedied soon.

Another neat fact about the Moravian church is that our denomination - the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America - is in Full Communion with them. This means that we have a lot in common, and because of our commonalities, we can work even closer together in worship, witness and Christian service. The Sarasota Moravian Church, I've also heard it called the Sarasota Fellowship, or Iglesia Morava, is a Nicaraguan congregation. The congregation speaks both Spanish and a local language called Miskito. The congregation is full of young people, so they worship and have their ministries in the evening. While we are working out the specifics, it looks like they would like to use the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall in the evenings (starting at 6p) on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, and also Sunday afternoon. They would like to begin in August. By then, we hope to have our school back in the Education Building. These are the times when our sanctuary/fellowship hall is not being used. St. Paul has also been praying for ways we can reach out to young and diverse people. In many ways I feel this is Spirit led. Of course, I have dreams of ways we can build relationships and grow and serve together, so I'm excited to see where this leads. If you have questions, please let me know.

The Congregation Council met for its regular monthly meeting on June 20, 2024, in person and by Zoom. They approved the following:

• Appointed Sandy Tull and Sharon Wittren to the audit team.

• Agreed that the church pay for duct cleaning of the school building in the amount of \$3,600 from the Capital Account.

• Agreed for Sarasota Moravian Church to use the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall pending review of the space usage agreement.

• Agreed to use the Capital Account for any loan needed to complete the Education Building Project.

• Hired Fonda Davies as Director of Music Ministries starting the end of August or the beginning of September.






Our new Director of Music, Fonda Davies will begin either the end of August or beginning of September. We welcome you to our St. Paul family.
